Frequently Asked Questions

What is the difference between the Workshop and the Study Pass?

The Workshop introduces students to the test-taking strategies for the whole test, typically for students who have not taken a previous test prep class. These classes allow students to familiarize themselves with the SAT or ACT in a structured and supportive environment.

The Study Pass offers a review of the material, with an emphasis on independent study and timed sections. Many students use these sessions to prepare for the second exam, to refresh after a break from tutoring, or to reinforce material in the workshop or private sessions.

How do I know if I should take the SAT or ACT?

If a student performed well on the PSAT, then prepare for the SAT. If the student's PSAT is weak and the student is strong in Math, I would take a diagnostic ACT to compare to the PSAT results. Doing some preliminary testing can make sure a student is taking the appropriate test.

How many times can a student take these tests?

There are no formal restrictions on how many times a student can take the SAT, ACT, or Subject Tests. As a general rule, I recommend taking the SAT or the ACT no more than three times.

Wouldn't it be better to take the test only once?

I would always plan to take the SAT or ACT 2-3 times. Many students improve with multiple testing and to plan on one test can actually increase test anxiety and lower performance. Many schools also combine the best sections from multiple test dates (which often raises the total score), leaving students who test only once at a disadvantage.

Do all schools accept ACT scores?

Yes. Accepting the ACT is now a standard practice in college admission.

If I take the ACT, do I still need to take the SAT?

No. Colleges will accept scores from the SAT or ACT.
